BOY SCOUT TROOP #248 CELEBRATES 100th ANNIVERSARY OF SCOUTING

Boy Scout Troop 248 earns unit citation award

Boy Scout Troop 248, of Oakdale, has earned the BSA National Outdoor Challenge Award for 2010-2011. This award is presented to Scout Units that excel in programming to offer their members a full and well rounded outdoor experience. The requirements require units to develop a short and long range calendar and activity plan, conduct at least 10 outdoor trips or activities, attend a long term resident camp and/or high adventure base, provide opportunities for every scout to earn one on the 25 outdoor field merit badges yearly, and to ensure the outdoors is preserved by conducting annual "Leave no Trace" training and activities yearly.

The troop was awarded the BSA Outdoor Challenge Award at the 100th Anniversary & Alumni Celebration on Feb. 12, 2011. Troop 248 is the first unit in Frontier District to earn this award.

Ten members of Boy Scout Troop 248 have qualified and have earned nineteen of the National BSA Gold Outdoor Badge in three different areas of expertise. The National BSA Outdoor Badge Award has 5 specific areas of interest where a scout may earn the award by showing above average skills and knowledge in the specific area which he has chosen to earn. The five areas are: Camping, Hiking, Aquatics, Riding, and High Adventure. Besides showing general knowledge in the specific field, scouts must earn a required amount of merit badges relating to that field and demonstrate leadership abilities by not only attending events but by planning them and carrying out plans for those events. Scouts who earn this award must demonstrate their knowledge by instructing younger scouts in that specific field.

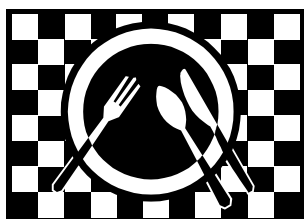

COUNCIL NEWS: The following actions were taken at the February 3, 2011 Borough Council Meeting:

A motion was approved by the Borough Council to approve a \$500.00 donation to the CharWest Cog for the Multi Municipal Police Training Fund. This Crisis Management Training Program was set up so that all officers in the CharWest Cog region receive the same training to respond to a municipal emergency or crisis.

A motion was made by the Borough Council to approve the purchase of Lot Nos. 492-M-334 and 492-M-338 through the Allegheny County Vacant Property Recovery Program. These lots are located across the street from the diner and will serve as additional parking for the diner and other borough events. The estimated cost of the property through this program is \$11,000 and the process will take approx. 6 months to complete.

OAKDALE YOUTH SEASON: The Oakdale Youth League Season is upon us. Soon our ball fields will be full of local youths playing Baseball and Softball. We try to teach sportsmanship, teamwork, and game skills. As part of the community we invest much of the money we raise through grants, donations and fundraisers back into the Oakdale parks. In the past 6 years we have invested over \$45,000 back into our parks, including field maintenance, concession stand upgrade, flood and snowstorm recovery and the erecting of a flagpole at The Borough Park the Youth League appreciates your support this upcoming season. Our fundraisers include our Annual Spaghetti Dinner, Friday April 8th from 4PM-8PM at the Community Center. Dinners are \$7 for adults and \$4 for children 10 and under. Our children are also selling raffle tickets with over \$3,000 in prizes. We invite you to stop and watch the Oakdale children play. The season starts the end of April and goes through June.
