



Council Meeting Minutes Summary

The Minutes from the May meeting and Treasurer’s Report were approved. The following motions were made and carried:

- Motion to ratify the execution of the ROWs necessary for work associated with the Confluence/RipRap project.
- Motion to adopt Resolution 4-2023 authorizing the Borough to enter into an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement with North Fayette Township allowing the Borough to utilize the Township’s UCC Board of Appeals and to execute the Agreement.
- Motion to accept the dedication of .19 acres from Bill Prion associated with his proposed subdivision filed with North Fayette Township and to sign any necessary documents.
- Motion to accept the Petition for Text Amendment to Borough Zoning Ordinance (allowing commercial recreation as a conditional use in I-1 zoning district) filed by Thomas Bianco and to accept \$1500 to be placed in escrow to pay for the expenses associated with said amendment.
- Motion to award Contract 2023-02 to Roto-Rooter Services Company in their bid amount of \$65,265.00 for the Sanitary Sewer Project.

- Motion to approve and pay Pay Application 1 for Police Station Renovations to Swede Construction Corp in the amount of \$69,749.
- Motion to approve and Pay Application 1 for Town Center Improvements Project Phase 1 to Decterra in the amount of \$100,000.
