February 2nd meeting was called to order. Minutes from January meeting were approved, and Treasurer’s Report was approved. The following motions were made and carried:

- Motion to reject bid for the Town Center Improvements Project Phase I and authorize KLH to redesign and readvertise the project.
- Motion to advertise Ordinance 2023-1 creating a key box ordinance, to provide for the regulation of key lock boxes within the Borough.
- Motion to amend agenda.
- Motion to accept quote from State Pipe Svcs., in the amount of \$4200 for repairs on sewer line at 206 Cottonwood Dr.
- Motion to hire Tom Rutowski as a part time police officer at a starting rate of \$17/hr.
