Residents of Oakdale Borough, you asked and you got it! Oakdale Borough is now accepting Credit Cards. Residents can now login to our newly designed website at www.oakdaleborough.com. Click Online Payments to make your water payments, borough taxes and much more. Did you know that there is always something going on in Oakdale! From normal everyday stuff like trash and leaf pick up to special events throughout the various organizations in town. However, one thing we noticed is that it is sometimes challenging to find information on the happenings around town. Enter Facebook! Back in 2013 we launched a Facebook page for the Borough to keep you posted on the happenings of Ins and Outs. There was such a great response we decided to keep the page. Today, we have 1,387 followers! But we know there are more people than that in Oakdale Borough! So what might you see on our Facebook page? We post based on season, special events, weather related events, local business events, and changes in trash and leaf scheduled pick up and live streaming of events. How can you find us on Facebook? Wow, what a winter!

Spring is the time of year when many of us make an extra effort to clean up all of the dead leaves, trash and litter left behind from winter and with anticipation to prepare for those long fun days of summer. Why not spend a nice family weekend sprucing up your property. Plant trees and shrubs, get rid of all the winter storm debris and trash around your home, paint the front porch. These actions will enhance the appearance of our neighborhoods, and increase property values. As spring approaches, please be sure to keep your landscaping properly maintained. Grass must be kept below ten inches, and sidewalks and public ways must not be obstructed with vegetation. We also ask for your help identifying and vacant properties. If you notice one in your neighborhood please contact the Oakdale Borough office at 724-693-9740 and keep us informed.

Leaves & Grass Pickup: Oakdale Borough Maintenance Crew will pick up leaves and grass every Monday from approximately April 1 through November 26. Leaves, grass clipping and lawn debris clippings need to be placed in biodegradable paper bags that do not exceed 40 pounds. No garbage, dirt or anything other than grass clippings or leaves can be placed in the bag or it will be left at the curb because it would be refused by the recycling company. **Leaves or Grass put out for pick up in any other type container will not be accepted.**

Tree limbs can be cut in lengths no greater than 4 feet and bundled with a diameter of no greater than 2 feet and each bundle cannot exceed 40 pounds. Individual limbs can be no larger than 3 inches in diameter.

Material must be placed at the curb before 5 a.m.

□ Jonathan DeBor made a motion to hire James King as a part time police officer for Oakdale Borough.

□ Kelly and Laura will start training on Credit Card Service for Borough Payments.

□ Bill Hartman, Jr. made a motion to adopt Oakdale Borough Resolution No. 5-2017 authorizing an application for a PA Small

Water and Sewer Program Grant for \$200,000 for the Water System Valve Replacement Program.

□ Bill Hartman, Jr. made a motion to authorize the Borough Manager to advertise requests for bids for the sale of property located at the Boy's Home Apartments Subdivision location.

□ Mr. Al Pifer made a motion to adopt Oakdale Borough Resolution No. 4-2017 recognizing the Oakdale Youth League as a civic association under the local options small games of chance act.

□ Chief Lauria reported that there were 69 varied police calls in February.

□ A home owner on Highland Ave had concerns regarding the low water pressure on Highland Ave and the water quality in that area. Council agreed to have the water tested and to have the hydrants flushed in that area.

□ Oakdale Youth League President, Ken Santucci, inquired about a change of locks at the Oakdale Ballpark, status of approval of a new scoreboard, and property

conditions behind the ballpark.

□ Ernie Thomas received approval from Borough Council to have a ceremony by the memorial plaque on the walking trail on May 19 to cele-

In early 2007, The Friends of Killbuck Lodge (FOKL), a non-profit 501c-3 organization, was formed and purchased Killbuck Lodge and properties with the intent of revitalizing this 200 year old structure located at 248 Clinton Ave. They purchased the building and grounds from the VFW Post 171, dedicating it to Scouting and community purposes. FOKL has been working diligently from that time to raise funds to complete the cabin and grounds. On May 13, 2015 the Borough of Oakdale proclaimed the "Killbuck Lodge Property" to be designated as a Historic Site. Also in 2015, the DIY Cable Network "Barnwood Builders" contacted FOKL and featured the cabin rebuilding in a filming of their network show. After much hard work, the cabin was reconstructed with a rededication ceremony on June 24, 2017. The cabin is proud to serve as the home of Boy Scout Troop 248 for weekly meetings, service projects and the annual Haunted Cabin. Troop 248 recently honored its 100th Eagle Scout. The next step is a permanent storage building and restroom. FOKL currently has an offer of a \$1500 donation if they are able to raise a like amount through donations by May 15, 2018. These funds will allow them to begin their next phase.
