HELP US CONTACT YOU!!

Oakdale maintains an Emergency Contact System that can be used to reach out to residents with an informational telephone message in various crisis situations, including Flooding, Water Alerts, and other threats to Community Safety.



The System initially contains Home(Main) Telephone Number data from Oakdale Borough's Water/ Sewage/Refuse Customer Records, and has been updated in cases where residents have provided information using the Emergency Information Sheet (previously mailed to Residents, and available on the Borough's Website). We strongly encourage residents to submit a completed form if you have not already done so, or if your contact information has changed. (Please note that some W/S/R Customer Records do not contain a Telephone Number!) The information can be submitted by printing, completing and delivering the form, which can be found on our website, or by clicking on the SwiftReach Portal Link and completing the on-line form. In the event of a critical situation such as a

boil water alert, we can only contact you with information/ instructions if your current contact number is in our system! For questions or additional information, please call or e-mail (secretary@oakdaleborough.com) the Borough Office.

February Council Meeting Update:

- Council President, Mark Maximovich, called the meeting to order.
- Mayor Hennemuth led the meeting in Prayer.
- Mr. Bob Fluegger of EAP Industries met with Council to give them pricing and information on updating the Borough water meters.
- Mr. Tom Potts made a motion to adopt Oakdale Borough Resolution No. 1-2018 updating fees for the Borough.
- Mr. Jonathan DeBor made a motion to approve a Settlement Agreement and Mutual Release with Hatch Chester.
- Mr. Bill Hartman and Ross Volkwein of KLH Engineers presented the Borough's PRP (Pollution Reduction Program) for the MS4 Program.
- Mr. Al Pifer announced that the 2018 Community Event Calendar will be published in the March Newsletter.
- Chief Lauria reported that there were 88 varied police calls in January.
- A business owner in Oakdale had concerns over the requirements needed to build a new building in a flood plain area.
- The fire department asked for an update on the status of their 2018 Borough Donation.
- Oakdale Borough Council has committed to donate 50% of the fire department's net fundraising balance each year with a maximum yearly amount of \$40,000. This yearly donation will be earmarked as part of the new fire truck's yearly loan payment.
- Oakdale Youth League President, Ken Santucci, was in attendance. The youth league is planning on purchasing a Score Board for the Greck Field.

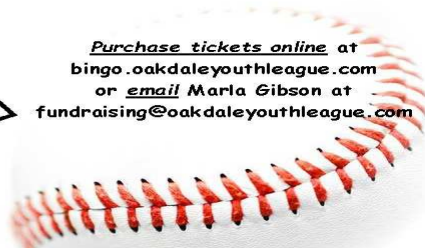
