Trick or Treating should be one of the great adventures of Halloween for kids! Be sure to go with your children or have them go with another adult or older (previously mailed to Residents, and child, and stick to the curfew of 8:00pm. bags to help drivers see them. Costumes, including masks and shoes, should be well-fitted to avoid blocked visions, trip

and falls. Stay on sidewalk, whenever possible, or on the far edge of the road facing traffic. Add a flashlight as a safety measure, and tell them not to eat Treats until they get home!

Remember that the Borough has had a "Curfew for Minors" Ordinance on the books for many years, and enforcement has become a priority in order to reduce vandalism opportunities and to keep our town safe.

The basis of the Ordinance is that it is unlawful for persons under the age of 18 to be in or upon the streets within the Borough at night during the period (secretary@oakdaleborough.com) the Borough Office. beginning at 11:00pm, and ending at 6:00am. Exceptions include cases when a minor is accompany by a parent or authorized adult, returning home following a school activity, returning home following job shift, and "reasonable necessity" as approved by the Borough Police.

can be used to reach out to residents with an informational telephone message in various crisis situations, including to Community Safety.

System initially contains Oakdale Borough's Water/ Sewage/Refuse Customer Records, and has been updated in cases where residents have provided information using the Emergency Information Sheet



available on the Borough's Website). We strongly Fasten reflective tape to costumes and encourage residents to submit a completed form if you have not already done so, or if your contact information has changed. (Please note that some W/S/R Customer Records do not contain a Telephone Number!) The information can be submitted by printing, completing and delivering the form, which can be found on our website, or by clicking on the SwiftReach Portal Link and completing the on-line form. In the event of a critical situation such as a boil water alert, we can only contact you with information/ instructions if your current contact number is in our system! - Mr. Tom Potts made a motion to advertise an ordinance amending part 2 licensing of transient retail businesses, section 201 thru 209 of the Borough Code of Ordinances.
- Mr. Jonathan DeBor made a motion to adopt proposed findings of fact and conclusion of law as to cancelling the laying out of Finance St., Zephyr St., and an unnamed alley.
- Mr. Jonathan DeBor made a motion to pass Oakdale Borough Ordinance No. 2017-3 authorizing the cancelling of the laying out of Finance St;, Zephyr St., and an unnamed alley
- Mr. Bill Hartman, Jr. made a motion to approve payment request no. 2 for the First Street Waterline Replacement Project in the amount of \$57,111.16 to Border Patrol.
- Mr. Al Pifer reminded everyone that the Oaktoberfest is on Saturday, September 23, from 3:00 pm to 8:00 pm featuring our own Helicon Brewery Beer. There will be plenty of delicious German food, German entertainment and activities for the whole family.

A Guide for Citizens

The battle against crime is the combined efforts of police and citizens. Because police cannot be all places, all times – the Oakdale Police Department is dependent on citizen cooperation in the fight against crime. Many crimes could be prevented if more citizens would be alert for suspicious activity and take appropriate measures to notify police.

When should I call the police?

If you observe suspicious activity, even though you may not be the only witness, take the initiative and call the Police. Do not rely on someone else to act – this may never happen. You could be the only caller, and police questioning the individuals seen lurking in or repeatedly traveling through areas often deters crimes.

Many people fail to act because they are no sure if what they are observing is worth reporting or afraid of retaliation. When in doubt, call the Police immediately. Don't lose precious time discussing the event with friends or neighbors first.

How Do I Report a Crime?

If you suspect that a crime is happening or is about to be committed, please dial 911. You need not give your name. However, if you want a police officer to contact you, give your name, address, and telephone number and advise the Emergency Communications Technician (the call taker) that you would like to meet with an officer.

What is suspicious activity?

• A stranger around your neighbor's house or a strange vehicle parked near your neighbor's home.

• The sound of breaking glass.

• Anyone peering into vehicles or removing tags, gasoline, or auto parts.

• An improperly parked car, or a parked car with someone in it that seems out of place.

• Someone carrying property such as TVs, stereos, or tools that can used to break into homes

• Apparent business transactions conducted from a vehicle or street corner.

- A constant flow of strangers to and from a particular house on a regular basis, especially during late evening hours.
- Persons involved in a fight or any explosion or scream.

• Door-to-door solicitations without an Oakdale solicitor's permit, or any stranger knocking on doors (burglars sometimes knock at the door first to see if anyone is at home).

- Recurring appearances of a strange vehicle in the neighborhood.
- Persons standing around, possibly acting as lookouts.

The Oakdale Police Department currently does not have fulltime staff to answer the phone. If no one answers the phone, listen to the answering machine message; it will give you a clear message on how to contact an Officer. Remember if you leave a message on the machine you feel is urgent and want immediate action, it may be a while before the messages are checked.

The Oakdale Police urge you to always go through dispatch; it is the quickest way to speak with an Officer. If it is an emergency ALWAYS dial 911.

The officers and members of the Oakdale Fire Dept have noticed cars blocking fire hydrants throughout the town. This is a dangerous and illegal practice, seconds count in a fire and the delays caused by cars parked too close or in front of a hydrant will cause significant delays. Pennsylvania law



prohibits parking within 15 feet of any fire hydrant, even for a couple minutes.



My street light is out, who should I call?

For street lights that are out or flickering, call the borough at 724-693-9740. If you can get a pole number, that is helpful, otherwise we'll need an address of the pole's location.

Oakdale Borough Maintenance Crew will be

having our Annual Leaf Pick up on the following day: Friday, October 27th. Please rake your leaves to the curb, no high leaf piles and bagging is not necessary. No limbs, sticks or garbage in the leaves. Long narrow piles are easier for the maintenance crew to



pick up. Maintenance will not rake the leaves to the street. More dates will be added in November.
