- □ Council President, Mark Maximovich, called the meeting to order and led the Opening Prayer.
- ☐ Jonathan DeBor reported that the Military Banner Program has been a tremendous success. Approximately 50 Banners have been displayed and there are another 13 applications at the Borough Office that will be submitted to the printer. There are roughly 60 more poles available through the main streets of Oakdale for more banners.
- Bill Hartman, Jr. made a motion to approve the low base bid of \$127,905.85 from Morgan Excavating for the 2018 Paving Project. The roads scheduled to be paved are First St. from Clinton Ave Drive voiced her concerns regarding to Fayette Ave. Robinson St. and Third St. are also being considered

for paving in 2018.

- ☐ Al Pifer thanked all who helped to make Memorial Day a great celebration in particularly Allegheny Golf Cart Rental for usage of the golf cart for our Vets to ride in. Additional thanks to Girl Scout Troop 17015 Olivia Ballard and Lisa DiSaia along with the adult guidance of Kelli Schroeffel Ballard, Keri Schroeffel, Paul Rylott, Carolyn Schroeffel and Heidi DiSaia, who helped prepare the bag lunches for West Allegheny Marching Band.

ALLEGHENY COUNTY VACANT PROPERTY RECOVERY PROGRAM 2018 SIDE YARD & **BLIGHTED STRUCTURE** PROPERTY ELIGIBILTY REQUIREMENTS

PROGRAM

APPLICANT ELIGIBILTY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for the Program, applicants:

Must be current on taxes, water, sewage and refuse bill on all properties owned in Allegheny County.

Must not have any outstanding code violations or municipal liens on properties owned in Allegheny County.

Cannot have acquired or be in the process of acquiring a property through the 2018 Side Yard and Blighted Structure Program.

Applications are subject to all requirements under the Program policies. Property eligibility will be determined on a case by case basis based upon consideration of a variety of factors related to blight. To be eligible for the Program, a property must at a minimum meet all preliminary eligibility requirements, including:

Be a vacant lot or vacant structure

September 30.

Have at least three years of tax delinquency

Be located in a participating municipality that has submitted the required program marketing plan.

* Application Deadline is August 31, 2018
