WHEN IT RAINS, IT DRAINS!

In Oakdale Borough, we are well aware of the end result of too much rain in a short period of time. Under the direction of the PA Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Oakdale continues to maneuver through the vast amount of Rules, Regulations and Restrictions, in order to develop the best Flood Prevention and Storm Water Management Plans for our situation. As Municipalities across the country continue to seek workable and affordable solutions, we believe that Public Education and Participation can make a real difference!

The DEP's MS4 (<u>M</u>unicipal <u>Separate Storm Sewer System</u>) Program was developed to ensure that Communities are being responsible with the collection and conveyance Storm Water.


<u>What is Storm Water?</u> Storm water is water from precipitation that flows across the ground and pavement when it rains or when snow and ice melt. The water seeps into the ground or drains into what we call "Storm Sewers." These are the drains you see at street corners or at low point on the sides of the streets. Collectively, the draining water is called "Storm Water Runoff."

<u>Why is Storm Water "Good Rain Gone Wrong?"</u> Storm water becomes a problem when it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt and other pollutants as it flows or when it causes flooding and erosion of stream banks. Storm water travels through a system of pipes and roadside ditches that make up Storm Water Systems. It eventually flows directly to a lake, river, stream, wetland or coastal water. All of the pollutants storm water carries along the way empty into our waters, too, because storm water doesn't get treated!

<u>What Happens When it Rains?</u> Rain is an important part of nature's water cycle, but there are times when it can do more damage than good. Problems related to Storm Water Runoff can include:

- Flooding caused by too much storm water flowing over hard surfaces such as roads and parking lots, instead of soaking into the ground
- Increased spending on Storm Drain and Sewer System maintenance and more expensive treatment technologies, due to the increase in pollutants carried by storm water
- Higher levels of bacteria, sediment and pollutants that make swimming unsafe and degrade important fish habitats

As we work to make sure that Oakdale is a viable and safe community, we ask that each Resident makes the decision to join the campaign! Please watch for additional information and project updates, and thank you for your help!

BOROUGH UPDATE

MAY BOROUGH COUNCIL MEETING UPDATE

- Council President, Huck Gamble, called the Meeting to order.
- Huck Gamble led the Meeting with a prayer.
- Mr. Jonathan DeBor made a Motion to approve Oakdale Borough Resolution No. 3-2016, declaring official intent to construct improvements to our drinking water system with funds received from the PA Infrastructure Investment Authority (First St. Waterline Replacement Project Loan with Pennvest).
- Mr. Jonathan DeBor made a Motion acknowledging Letter of Responsibility and authorizing Solicitor to carryout responsibilities associated with Pennvest Loan.
- Mr. Jonathan DeBor made a Motion to approve with conditions, RAT's Lot Consolidation Plan and to approve the Land Development Plan for the proposed Helicon Brewery.
- Mr. Tom Potts made a Motion to approve payment request from Gary Metzinger Cement Contractor for the First St. Bridge Deck Replacement Project in the amount of \$109,815.63. Final payment will be made after final walk thru inspection by Chester Engineers.
- Mr. Tom Potts made a Motion to accept low paving bid of \$338,561.20 from Youngblood Paving for the 2016 Oakdale Paving Project. The streets to be included in this Project are: Oak Heights Dr, Maple Ave, June Alley, Industrial Park Dr, Hastings Ave, Spring St, Myrtle St, and the Borough owned lot between The Rock and the Oakdale Inn.
- Mr. Bill Hartman, Jr. made a Motion to approve Oakdale Borough Resolution No. 4-2016, amending the Garbage Ordinance.
- Mr. Bill Hartman announced that the next Borough Event will be the Memorial Day Parade and Honor Roll Ceremony on May 30. The Parade begins at 10:00am followed by the Memorial Service at the Honor Roll. Join us after the Service at the Community Center for refreshments.
- Several Oakdale Business Owners expressed their concerns with the Storm Drains on Seminary Ave. Borough to check all downtown Catch Basins and to have problem Basins vacuum cleaned.
- A Resident of Maple Ave reported that cars are traveling the wrong way on Maple Ave., which is a one way street.
- A Resident of Hastings Ave reported that vehicles filled with junk are being parked on the street by someone who doesn't live there. A vehicle was removed, and Chief Lauria will follow up with the vehicle owner.
- Chief Lauria reported that there were 65 varied Police Calls in April.

A Service Line Warranty Program, like the "Insurance" offered by Gas and Electric Providers, can provide coverage on the Interior and Exterior Water and Sewer Lateral Lines, as well as In-Home Plumbing, thereby relieving the Homeowner of some or all of the financial burden associated with Water and Sewer Line Repairs or Replacement, necessitated by fluctuating temperature, tree root penetration, corrosion and much more!

Oakdale Borough is proud to now be able to offer Protection to its Residents. Utility Service Partners (endorsed by the National League of Cities) will soon begin to send Informational Mailings to all Oakdale Borough Residents. TRASH & RECYCLING: CHANGES AND REMINDERS

In an effort to control costs, Oakdale Borough continues to collect Trash and Recycle from its Residents.

Reminders:

- Trash is collected on Monday and Recycle is collected on Tuesday, unless otherwise posted.
- Collections may begin as early as 6:00am; therefore Items (cans, bags, etc.) should be <u>taken to the Curb</u> before that time, in order to ensure pick up.
- Cans/Bags/Boxes should be no larger than 4' x 4' and should weigh no more than 40 lbs.
- Recycle may NOT be placed in Plastic Bags, but may be placed in Cardboard Boxes.
- Large and/or Heavy Items (Furniture, Appliances w/o Freon, Carpeting, etc.) will require a Tag, which may be purchased at the Borough Building at a cost of \$15/Tag.
- Gas Powered Items (lawn mowers, weed wackers, etc.) must be drained of gas and oil, and the caps must be removed.
- Construction/Building Materials may not be placed in Curbside Trash or Recycle. (Disposal Bags may be purchased from Home Depot or Lowes, and pick up will be scheduled through the Store.)
- <u>Television Sets are no longer eligible for Curbside Pickup</u>! Periodically, special Collection Events are scheduled near our area, which are advertised through *The Oakdale Borough Times*.

Updates:

The following Items will not be accepted for Trash or Recycle Collection -

- Ashes from Fireplaces or Wood Burning Stoves
- Building Materials/Roofing/Flooring, Concrete, Dirt, Sod, Stone, Asphalt, Railroad Ties, Landscape Ties, Chain Link Fence Rolls, Brick, Block, Tree and Shrub Stumps
- Car Parts, Tires, Car Batteries, Oil, Gasoline, Anti-Freeze and other similar Vehicle Fluids
- Liquid Paint, Animal Carcasses, large Pianos/Organs, Cast Iron Tubs, Propane Tanks, other items determined to require special handling, and those items excluded by Landfill Regulation.
